PROGRAM INFORMATION

APPLICATIONS:

May be returned to LP Wilson, 601 Matianuck Avenue in person or by mail. Mail-in registration deadline is June 17, 2010. Early registration helps insure spaces and facilitates planning and hiring of staff. Last minute registrations may be made in person on June 18, 21, & 22 at LP Wilson Community Center Room 20 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. A \$10.00 per course late fee will be charged starting the first day of class. Questions may be directed to Windsor Summer School, 687-2000, ext. 271.

FEES:

Tuition is due upon registration. Some ***limited*** scholarships based on need (school free or reduced lunch program/residents only – ***25% reduction***) are available. ***Enrichment programs are not included.*** Non-residents pay an additional \$25.00. A \$10.00 late fee per course will be charged starting the first day of each program. DCF payment approval forms must be submitted at registration.

TUITION REFUNDS:

A full refund is available only if notice of withdrawal is given prior to the first class session.

TRANSPORTATION:

Responsibility of the student.

ATTENDANCE/DISMISSAL:

In a 16 to 20 day summer session, perfect attendance, punctuality, and behavior are expected. Students, who are disruptive, insubordinate or evidence little interest in learning, may be dismissed without refund of tuition. Absence and/or tardiness may result in loss of credit. Smoking is NOT permitted on school grounds and will result in disciplinary action, including dismissal. Maximum absences allowable for credit eligibility are two. Three tardies equal one absence.

CLASS CANCELLATION:

The Summer School Administration reserves the right to cancel courses in the event a teacher is not available or enrollment is not sufficient to support the class.

CONFIRMATION:

No confirmation notice will be sent. Assume the class will run as scheduled unless notified to the contrary.

CLASS TIMES:

Some programs will be organized by session – 8:00am-11:00am and 11:30am-2:30pm. Other programs may be 8:00am-1:00pm, 9:00am-11:30am or individually scheduled by instructors as noted.

CREDIT INFORMATION

Review courses offered for high school credit in Windsor Summer School are intended for those students who have failed a course previously during the regular school year. **While all Windsor students may receive .50 or 1.0 credit per course toward graduation**, other towns may award appropriate credit in their own school systems. Reports of summer school achievement will be forwarded to the various guidance departments for their consideration.

All courses are open to students for enrichment with the approval of their guidance counselor to improve skills, meet prerequisites of advanced courses, and/or improve their grade average.
Students will receive the average of both courses but not lower than the previous grade earned.

**A TOTAL OF 60 CLASS HOURS FOR 1.0 CREDIT COURSES AND
36 HOURS FOR .5 CREDIT COURSES
WILL BE OFFERED PER SESSION.**

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO DETERMINE CREDIT ELIGIBILITY WITH THE GUIDANCE PERSONNEL AT THEIR OWN SCHOOL PRIOR TO ENROLLMENT.

WINDSOR STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR .50 CREDIT PER SESSION FOR REVIEW COURSES MUST:

- have been previously enrolled in course.
- have earned a passing grade or better in at least one of the two marking periods.
- have been actively enrolled in the course throughout its duration.
- have their guidance counselor's approval to take the course.

WINDSOR STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR 1.0 CREDIT PER SESSION FOR REVIEW COURSES MUST:

- have been previously enrolled in course.
- have earned a passing grade or better in at least 40% of the course (each marking period = 20% and each exam = 10%).
- have been actively enrolled in the course throughout its duration.
- have their guidance counselor's approval to take the course.

ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Since students are reviewing a year's worth of work in 20 classes, the following attendance criteria will apply:

- loss of credit upon the third absence.
- three (3) tardies equals 1 absence.
- there are no excused absences.

REVIEW ENGLISH 9	1 CREDIT	JUNE 28-JULY 29	\$220
This course reviews various genres of literature, including the short story, the novel, poetry, and drama. It also covers nonfiction works. Students use the literature to develop expository compositions and to practice speaking and performing skills. Attention is given to spelling, vocabulary development, conventional English usage, mechanics, and grammar. WHS			
REVIEW ENGLISH 10	1 CREDIT	JUNE 28-JULY 29	\$220
This review course emphasizes expository and persuasive writing in conjunction with the study of American writers, their ideas, styles and historical significance. Students learn major topics and themes of American literature, develop their vocabulary and learn research techniques. WHS			
REVIEW ENGLISH 11-12	1 CREDIT	JUNE 28-JULY 29	\$220
This Grade 11-12 review course focuses on literature from various world cultures and disciplines and also emphasizes the structure and development of personal, persuasive and analytical essays. Further development of vocabulary and library research techniques is included. WHS			

MATHEMATICS
